Mother Care: Physical Care and Beyond After a Baby Dies - specifically for mothers after a late miscarriage, stillbirth or early infant death. Its focus is mainly on regaining health and is intended to be given to mothers while still in the hospital. It focuses on physical realities after a loss, including nutrition, hygiene, breast care, and uterine exercises. The second half of the book focuses on emotional and spiritual care. Sherokee Ilse, Inez Anderson, and Mary Funk. (Wintergreen Press 20 pages)

Empty Arms - one of the classics that began the movement to understand the grief that comes with infant death. Author Sherokee Ilse covers the feelings, fears, fantasies and options that families face. It offers suggestions and support for decision-making at the time of loss and in the days and months that follow. Over 150,000 copies sold. (88 pages)

Empty Cradle, Broken Heart: Surviving the Death of Your Baby by Deborah L. Davis, Ph.D. who relays the message "You are not alone and you can survive." A very comprehensive book on the grief suffered after the death of a child. The "Points To Remember" at the end of every chapter are a wonderful way of re-finding something later to reaffirm the healing process. (Fulcrum Publishing, 232 pages)

She Was Born, She Died is a "collection of poetry following the death of an infant" by Marion Cohen. The booklet contains more than three dozen poems ranging from "Denial Poem," and "The Main Problem with Tragedy," to "Trying to Conceive" and "Dead-ness as a Disability." There is some "in your face" honesty and rawness in this one. (32 pages)

Coping With Holidays And Celebrations by Sherokee Ilse who examines the difficulty one faces on holidays or at family gatherings after the loss of a child. This booklet examines the feelings that one may have on these occasions and offers suggestions in dealing with relatives or friends who may force participation "for your own good." It contains positive suggestions for turning those days of difficulty toward inner reflection and even celebration of the baby. (12 pages)

Miscarriage: A Man's Book by Rick Wheat, a Marriage and Family Therapist who has experienced the difficulties of miscarriage first-hand. Wheat has "an emergency page" with nine items a man should know right away when his wife has just had a miscarriage, including "recognize the importance" of this event. "This may well be the worst thing that has ever happened to your wife and maybe to you, too." He talks about things that will be difficult, and recognizes what has been lost. He discusses the stages of grief and some of the responses that may result such as guilt, depression or withdrawal. He also gives some tips on how to keep the marital relationship strong after such a devastating event. (24 pages)

A Father's Story - Timothy Nelson shares his experiences after the 1983 stillbirth of his daughter, Kathleen. The first section of the booklet was written shortly after Kathleen died. It captures the trauma and pain that he suffered as he recounts his story from the first sign of trouble in the pregnancy. The second part of the booklet was written 10 years later. It chronicles how Kathleen's death played a significant role in the relationship between he and his wife, Monica, in subsequent pregnancies, and in the lives of their living children. It includes feelings about the first holiday after the death, the conflict over going to a support group, the first anniversary of Kathleen's birth, and the anniversaries since. (24 pages)

The experience of grieving can be complicated and lonely for single parents who have no partner to be there for them. Practical suggestions and information offer hope and help. (20 pages)

A Time to Decide, A Time to Heal: For parents making difficult decisions about babies they love is written by mothers and fathers who have faced the news of fetal anomaly with grief and courage. The authors look at the steps involved in the decision to continue or to end the pregnancy, *with the book's real strength (and largest portion) being in the comprehensive approach it takes to healing grief after a decision to terminate is made.* (Pineapple Press, 110 pages)

Grieving Grandparents With the impending birth of a baby, prospective grandparents dream of this new and exciting addition to the family. Critical information is shared to aid grandparents as they attempt to comfort and support their children while they also learn to cope with their own grief. Many specific suggestions will make it easier to know how to make a difference in their children's lives. (Wintergreen Press, 12 pages)

Carol Cirulli Lanham writes:

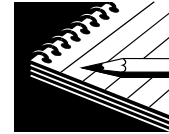

A Place To Remember: Memories Of Our Baby—is a special place to record the information on a baby who has died due to miscarriage, stillbirth, or infant death. Like a traditional baby book, it includes sections on the parents, the family tree, name information and vital statistics, baptism/dedication, and a place for footprints, handprints, and a lock of hair. But more than a traditional baby book, it has places to record the funeral/memorial service, a place for immediate family to record special thoughts, and finally a place to record feelings on the anniversaries through the baby's tenth birthday. Meant to be a memento of lasting importance, it is printed on fine quality, heavy text paper in a pastel grey ink with an embossed white and pale blue cover. Its size is perfect to place inside of our Memory Box. (A Place To Remember, 28pages)

Remembrance Journal: In Memory of My Precious Baby offers a place to record hopes, dreams and memories. With soft pictures and warm thoughts interspersed throughout the many lines available for writing on, this journal is an ideal place to record the pregnancy and loss experience. Our Baby Died. Why?, seven-year-old Jake Erling tells the story of his life during the pregnancy and stillbirth of his brother, Jesse. He shares his grief experience from a child's perspective, and relates an accounting of his mother's subsequent pregnancy and the birth of his twin siblings. *This is not only Jake's story, but a place for children who have also lost a baby brother or sister to journal their thoughts and feelings.* Questions are posed throughout the book and space is provided for children to write or draw their response. For younger children, parents are encouraged to read the book aloud, ask the related questions and write down their child's responses. As time goes on, Our Baby Died. Why? can serve as a beloved keepsake of memories for the bereaved brother or sister. (A Place To Remember, 36 pages)
